# Environmental Science ~ Impromptu Speech

**LEVEL:** High School (HS)

**DIVISION(S):** Grades 9/10 and Grades 11/12

**COMPOSITION OF TEAM:** 2-3 students per team

**NUMBER OF TEAMS:** Preliminary – Determined by your local MESA center

Regional – # of teams per division at the discretion of each region

(Northern, Central, LA/Central Coast, and Southern)

**SPONSORS:** UC Irvine MESA College Prep

San Jose State University MESA College Prep

OVERVIEW: Changes, if any, from "DRAFT" rules are highlighted in "yellow."

Teams shall research and prepare to deliver a short impromptu speech based on one

of the 3 official environmental science topics below.

Participation logistics and limits may vary by host site. Advisors and students are

responsible for verifying this information with their local MESA center.

**MATERIALS:** The host MESA Center will provide the following:

- Competition questions
- One index card and pencil per team member

#### **GENERAL RULES:**

- 1) Teams **must** consist of 2 to 3 students. Individual participants will not be allowed to compete.
- 2) Prior to MESA Day, teams must research EACH of the three topics listed below.
  - a. The Carbon Footprint of Battery Production
  - b. Environmental Impact of Artificial Intelligence (AI) and Data Mining
  - c. Environmental Pollution and E-Waste Management
- 3) On MESA Day, teams will receive 6 questions, 2 from each of the topic areas listed above. Teams will randomly draw 2 of the questions and may select which **one** of the two on which they wish to present. The team **must** present on the question drawn/chosen.
- 4) Once the team receives the question they will have two (2) minutes to organize and prepare as a team to present.
- 5) Each team member will receive one index card and one pencil which may be used during both the preparation period and presentation.

- 6) No additional reference materials, presentations, props, judge handouts, or visual aids are allowed.
- 7) Teams will have up to five (5) minutes to present their topic. All team members should actively participate in the presentation.

## JUDGING:

- 1) Judges will determine team order by random selection and will post the team order prior to the start of competition.
- 2) The team must be ready to present when called or forfeit the competition.
- 3) Only judges, MESA staff, and competing teams will be allowed in the competition room.
- 4) Presentation may not exceed 5 minutes. Once 5 minutes has elapsed, teams will be stopped and prevented from speaking beyond the 5 minute mark.
- 5) Judges will provide time signals at the following intervals: one (1) minute, thirty (30) seconds, and five (5) seconds remaining.
- 6) At the conclusion of each presentation the panel of judges shall evaluate each team according to the Scoring Sheet. Judges' scores will be averaged to determine final scores.
- 7) In the event of a tie, the team with the highest "Content" score shall be the winner. If teams are still tied, duplicate awards shall be given.

#### **AWARDS:**

- Awards will be given per division: Grades 9/10 and Grades 11/12.
- Medals will be awarded for 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, and 3<sup>rd</sup> place.
- Please check with your MESA center to determine the number of teams that advance to Regional MESA Day.
