

MESA DAY CONTEST RULES 2025-2026

Environmental Science ~ Prepared Speech

LEVEL: Middle School (MS)

DIVISION(S): Grade 6 and Grades 7/8

COMPOSITION OF TEAM: 2-3 students per team

NUMBER OF TEAMS: Preliminary – Determined by your local MESA center

Regional – # of teams per division at the discretion of each region

(Northern, Central, LA/Central Coast, and Southern)

SPONSORS: UC Irvine MESA College Prep

San Jose State University MESA College Prep

OVERVIEW: Changes, if any, from "DRAFT" rules are highlighted in "yellow."

> Teams will choose a topic from the official topic list, research, prepare, and deliver a short prepared speech which demonstrates their knowledge of the subject matter.

Participation logistics and limits may vary by host site. Advisors and students are

responsible for verifying this information with their local MESA center.

MATERIALS: The host MESA Center will provide the following:

- Internet-enabled computer and projector with HDMI/USB/VGA cables (verify with host Center)
- Standard table

GENERAL RULES:

- 1) Teams **must** consist of 2 to 3 students. Individual participants will not be allowed to compete.
- 2) Prior to MESA Day, teams **MUST** select one of the topics below.
 - a. The Carbon Footprint of Battery Production
 - i) Examine the environmental impact of mining and processing raw minerals and metals (e.g., lithium, cobalt, nickel, rare earth elements, etc.) needed for battery production.
 - b. Environmental Impact of Artificial Intelligence (AI) and Data Mining
 - i) Examine the relationship between Al data centers and air quality in surrounding neighborhoods.

- c. Environmental Pollution and E-Waste Management
 - i) Examine how the improper disposal of electronics threatens environmental health and sustainability.
- 3) Teams must research their topic, thoroughly prepare, and rehearse an oral presentation that clearly demonstrates their collective ideas.
- 4) Teams may use notes during the delivery of their presentation, however they should not read their presentation.
- 5) Teams MUST use at least one visual aid which assists in the understanding of the topic. Visual aids may include but are not limited to: PowerPoint/slideshow presentation, model, handout, poster, or video (confirm audio compatibility with host center).
- 6) Each team will have one (1) minute to prepare and up to five (5) minutes to present. All team members should actively participate in the presentation.
- 7) Teams which advance to Regional MESA Day may use the same topic presented during the Preliminary competition.

JUDGING:

- 1) Judges will determine team order by random selection and will post the team order prior to the start of competition.
- 2) The team must be ready to present when called or forfeit the competition.
- 3) Only judges, MESA staff, and competing teams will be allowed in the competition room.
- 4) Presentation may not exceed 5 minutes. Once 5 minutes has elapsed, teams will be stopped and prevented from speaking beyond the 5 minute mark.
- 5) Judges will provide time signals at the following intervals: one (1) minute, thirty (30) seconds, and five (5) seconds remaining.
- 6) At the conclusion of each presentation, the panel of judges shall evaluate each team according to the Scoring Sheet. Judges' scores will be averaged to determine final scores.
- 7) In the event of a tie, the team with the highest "Content" score shall be the winner. If teams are still tied, duplicate awards shall be given.

AWARDS:

- Awards will be given per division: Grades 6 and Grades 7/8.
- Medals will be awarded for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place.
- Please check with your MESA center to determine the number of teams that advance to Regional MESA Day.
